

Medication Packaging

All SLC camper medication is packed by Drug World Pharmacy.



All families must register:

All medication dispensed at camp must be processed through Drug World to ensure compliance and safety. This includes:

- Any prescription medications, planned or unplanned
- Any daily or as-needed medications
- OTC medications, vitamins or supplements (in any form)

IMPORTANT

All families must register with Drug World, even if child does not require medication. Failure to register will result in a \$100 late fee if child needs a prescription filled at camp.

How does it work?

- Go to <https://drugworld.com/slc-summer-camp> to register your camper.
- If your child takes medication, contact your doctor to send their prescriptions directly to Drug World.
- Drug World will package your camper's medications in individual doses, each labeled with your child's name and the specific time for administration.
- Drug World will deliver your camper's individually packed medications directly to camp.

What is the deadline for registration?

- Full Summer: June 5
- Session 1: June 5
- Mini-Camp: June 5
- Session 2: July 10

If you register after the deadline, Drug World Pharmacy will apply a late fee of \$100 if medication is ordered. No exceptions will be made.

How much does it cost?

- Registration includes a \$2 processing fee.
- You'll be responsible for regular copays, and OTC medications will be priced competitively.
- **Families who miss the pharmacy deadline will incur a late fee of \$100.**

Are there exceptions for certain medications?

- Exceptions for specific medications will be considered on a case-by-case basis.
- To be eligible, you must be listed on the "Bringing Meds" list compiled by Drug World.

All approved medications must arrive at camp by opening day in new, sealed, and unexpired condition, accompanied by a physician's note with directions.
